3. Discussion with Prof Shamsul Alam regarding Delta Centre

DeltaCap has developed a discussion note on a coordination mechanism for capacity development for BDP2100. 4. Urbanizing Deltas of the World meeting in The Hague, 21-22 March 2019

The annual meeting was held in the Netherlands to discuss progress of the programme. A mechanism to further translate knowledge developed in the research programme to practice has been opened up for proposals (link to more information).

5. New project: Joint Collaboration Programme

IWM, CEGIS, Deltares and WUR have started a longer term collaboration for knowledge cooperation, partly supported by the Embassy of the Kingdom of the Netherlands. During the inception phase (December 2018 – May 2019). In this programme, applied research is undertaken to address knowledge questions related to implementation of BDP2100.
