### **Delta Alliance Resilience Strategy**

The Delta Alliance mission of improving the resilience of deltas worldwide will be realized in partnership with other organizations through:

#### 1. envisioning and defining resilience for deltas;

<u>e.g. Short Term (2010 – 2012)</u>

- create visions for resilient deltas with local stakeholders
- develop a framework for defining and measuring resilience in deltas
  - o create international Resilience Working Group to lead this work
    - high profile researchers from diverse disciplines known for deltaspecific work
      - partner with World Estuary Alliance
  - review and perform research into criteria and measuring of resilience within deltas
  - various aspects of resilience must be considered e.g. ecosystems, economy, governance, geo-physical system

e.g. Long Term (2012 onward)

- include new Wings into the Delta Alliance network through events that support local stakeholders to envision their resilient delta
- continue refinement of the framework for defining and measuring resilience in deltas

#### 2. measuring and monitoring resilience;

<u>e.g. Short Term (2010 – 2012)</u>

 a Comparative Overview of Delta Issues led by Delta Alliance Netherlands Wing will provide insight into the current state of 8 deltas worldwide and their strategies for improved resilience

e.g. Long Term (2012 onward)

- annual review of resilience in select deltas, based on the framework developed by the Resilience Working Group
  - bring together information and people from multiple sectors to give a broad view of the state of the delta and identify gaps in information

#### 3. reporting resilience and advocating for improved resilience;

<u>e.g. Short Term (2010 – 2012)</u>

• invite people and organizations to sign the Delta Alliance Declaration calling for action towards more resilient deltas (first signatures on the Declaration to be received at the celebration of the launch of Delta Alliance in Rotterdam, 30<sup>th</sup> September 2010)

e.g. Long Term (2012 onward)

- regular "Delta Report Cards" reporting on the resilience of select deltas
  - o prizes for positive progress
  - presenting an overall rating that gives a quick understanding of how resilient a delta is, with supporting detail that provides depth across sectors and can stand up to scientific scrutiny
  - o partner with World Estuary Alliance
- presentations at international events by members of Resilience Working Group and Delta Alliance Ambassadors

#### 4. providing inspiration for improved resilience;

#### <u>e.g. Short Term (2010 – 2012)</u>

- showcase best practices and lessons learned in deltas through workshops, presentations, websites, and newsletters
  - including delta planning, management, projects, and response to damaging events

#### <u>e.g. Long Term (2012 onward)</u>

 design sessions that include practitioners and experts from deltas around the world

#### 5. and providing assistance for improved resilience.

- <u>e.g. Short Term (2010 2012)</u>
  - create Delta Response Team of international experts and practitioners to provide rapid support when damaging events occur
  - attract funding for projects that contribute to improved resilience in deltas
  - co-create innovative projects with partner organizations and funding agencies
  - strengthen the international network in exchanging information and expertise resources in and between deltas worldwide
    - o improve and encourage use of <u>www.delta-zones.com</u>
    - o dynamic communication that highlights network members and activities
  - create Young Delta Alliance to support the Delta Response Team and Resilience Working Group

#### <u>e.g. Long Term (2012 onward)</u>

- prepare Guidelines for delta management and response
- capacity-building program for delta management and response
  courses and expert exchanges
- comments and recommendations from the Resilience Working Group for delta management plans and specific projects
