The Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) was released its 6th Assessment Report (AR6) for Working Group 1 on 9th August. Climate Change 2021: The Physical Science Basis. The Working Group I contribution to the Sixth Assessment Report is the most up-to-date physical understanding of the climate system and climate change, bringing together the latest advances in climate science, and combining multiple lines of evidence from paleoclimate, observations, process understanding, and global and regional climate simulations.
